Secretary/Manager Update

Winter well and truly arrived with the mid-December spell of ice, snow and frost leading to our first closure of the new season. But neither the weather nor the brief disruption to the course has slowed the rate of activities taking place in the clubhouse and the team Datchet have continued to deliver a range of functions from musical evenings, society dinners, festive lunches as well as Sunday carveries and the Quiz night.

The first of the Night Golf events in November was a great success with over 50 players taking part in calm and dry conditions (conditions, if I am honest, which did not quite justify the amount of lovely mulled wine devoured before play commenced!). Feedback for the evening was very good and with everybody properly attired and well-illuminated there were no mishaps and some good scores. In the end the event was oversubscribed but members who missed out this time will be given priority for the next event scheduled for January (date to be confirmed). We shall reserve some tee positions to allow for this but if anyone who missed out wants to pre-book a slot please just come and see me and I will arrange.

I would like to give some recognition for the hard work already done by *Paul Cook*, DGC Professional, concerning the future development plans for our Schools Programme.

This groundwork done by Paul has resulted in Datchet Golf Club becoming recognised as an official *HSBC Golf Roots Centre* for delivering quality programmes for Junior Golf awarded by *The Golf Foundation* and one of the practical results of this is that we receive funding for our junior development initiatives.

In addition to these developing plans with schools and our aspiration to design a recognised pathway for school pupils to progress to become juniors at Datchet Golf Club, we are also re-establising a *Junior Golf Academy Programme*. This programme had previously been delivered at Huntswood Golf Club and has now moved over with me to Datchet.

We also recently met with representatives from Bucks Berks & Oxon Golf and for 2018 Datchet has been awarded with the status of an official BB&O County Hub Centre for Junior Golf. This is a great recognition of DGC's ability to provide both course facilities and an environment to enable juniors to develop their golfing knowledge and skills within and a safe and supportive structure.

All of these plans help support delivery of our commitment within the CASC regime to be recognised as a club that is open to all range of ability, age and economic status. And the conversion of school pupils to juniors, and then to fully-fledged members, is inextricably linked to the key part of our long-term strategy to strengthen the depth of our membership particularly at the younger end of the spectrum.

Paul and myself will now work together to re-invigorate the junior section of Datchet Golf Club.

Very briefly in other matters:

- The new club brochure has gone to print and looks great (copies available shortly).
- Our new website and DGC App will be launching in January 2018.
- A virtual course fly over will also be available on the website in January.
- Including AGM updates in the Club Diaries will result in a slight delay in delivery.
- The New 9 Hole Monthly Competition has now kicked off and despite a slow start due to snow we have had some good entries considering the time of year. We might tweak this as it develops and may be look at weekend golf, if agreed by the Committee. I would like to thank Bob Bussley for his hard work and timely turnaround of new cards, a standard scratch score and being granted a 9-hole certificate.
- Other new competitions for the summer are a Four Ball Better Ball Team Event being held on the 10th June as well as a weekly Friday roll-up/fun night with varied formats for members and guests.

As the Captain has mentioned, in April we will be holding a Family Open Day for new golfers of all ages and experienced golfers looking to change or join Datchet Golf Club. This will be in the form of many fun skill challenges, a tuition centre, nearest the pin, an 8-hole Stableford competition, which should be an exciting day for all. However, for this to succeed we will need many volunteers to help on the day. Please could I support Ryan's request that you make a note in your diary and look out for the helpers list to be issued.






